

CHINA STUDY TRIP TO NANJING

-May 21-25, 2023

HC China Study Trip resumes in 2023 after the Pandemic. With the great support of Hong Kong And Macao Affairs Office Of The State Council (國務院港澳事務辦公室) and invited by Liaison Office Of The Central People's Government In The Macao S.A.R. (中央人民政府駐澳門特別行政區聯絡辦公室), this year, Prof. Dennis WANG led a group of 27 HC students to Nanjing, Jiangsu province for a 5-day study trip. This trip provides a very precious opportunity for HC students to study and know more about the development of the economic, historical and cultural aspects of China. 
ALUMNI SHARING

-Apr 26, 2023






The training workshop was host by Mr. James LAW, HCAA



Sharing from Student Volunteers of HC Volunteer Programme (HVP)

The Honours College Volunteer Programme (HVP) in AY2022/2023 offered me an incredible opportunity to participate in a volunteer work that I had never done before. During the programme, the elders told me about their lifetime, like their personal experience, former career, and their favorites. I also listened to their suggestions on how to live a happy life.

Besides, we also had a training on how to feed the elders, serve them food, and deal with their requirements. By the end of the programme, we tried feeding the elders and serving the food to them. We learnt how to talk to them respectfully and patiently.

This volunteer program gave me many opportunities to reflect on myself. I am always cautious and shy to talk to the elderly because I am quite worried about the generation gap and judgment. However, the elders I met at Pou Tai Center were extremely friendly, approachable, and extremely open-minded. Listening to each person's life story, I realized that although they have different lives and difficulties, they are all happy and satisfied. One of the things that they impress me a lot is the satisfaction that they have lived a good life. However, it is inevitable that there are regrets, some feel regrets about health, learning or experiences. I received advice about trying to explore more, learn more, travel more, and enjoy life while still being healthy, because youth only come once in a lifetime. Some old people remind me about the importance of education. Through talking and collecting some stories from the elderly there, I feel their joy and vitality. The old people there feel rejuvenated and hear many new things from us - representatives of young people. I then realized that age in some ways reflects an entire generation, but sometimes it is just a number to describe physical differences, not mental differences.

I have come across various tasks during my service hour at Pou Tai, for example chatting with the elderly, doing exercise with the elderly, playing some educational toys with the elderly. I acted as the listener, presenter as well as their friend. My obligation is to listen to their stories and share the world with them, ensure their safety when doing exercise, do exercise together with them to boost their incentive to move, and provide help when needed when playing educational toys. My objective of joining the HC Volunteer programme is to get to know more about the elderly, try my best to help them, which is also a kind of contribution to the whole society.

With the precious chance to chat with the elderly, I gained much experience from them. Some shared how they struggled for their life when they were young in order to make a living for their family. Some shared how they moved to other countries and lived there (like Vietnam, Burma). Some even encouraged me to study hard and learn more at my age. I was inspired by their lives, and I received a clear view of the world at their age. Some history events they mentioned in our talk were only seen in my textbook, however, the elderly were the ones that witnessed everything. This feeling was amazing!

This program is meaningful and educational. It is worth for the future HC students to join. It is a way to make a contribution to the society and wider one's own horizon at the same time. It could nurture students' concepts for giving care to the elderly that could build a harmonious environment.
