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

CHINA STUDY TRIP TO SHANGHAI, CHINA

May 20-24, 2024

With the great support of Hong Kong and Macao Affairs Office of the State Council (國務院港澳事務辦公室) and invited by Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the Macao S.A.R. (中央人民政府駐澳門特別行政區聯絡辦公室), this year, Prof. Victoria LEI led a team of 25 HC students to Shanghai for a 5-day study trip, dated May 20-24, 2024. During the trip, the team met with the local leaders of the Foreign Affairs Office of Shanghai Municipal People's Government, and interacted with the students of Shanghai Jiao Tong University and Fudan University, as well as visited state enterprises and showrooms, like Shanghai Auto Museum, Site of the First National Congress of the Chinese Communist Party and Sihang Warehouse Memorial Hall, etc.



Macao community or taking on the task of writing, staging and performing their own original plays in a one day workshop, I have regularly been impressed by the teamwork and earnestness of HC students.

It can be all too easy to disengage when facing new challenges, especially ones outside of your own academic discipline or field. The value of taking interdisciplinary risks comes in the chance to learn from new people and experiences and through this gain the opportunity to see things from a new vantage point. This is also increasingly true in the wider academic community; in academia there is a renewed push to work across disciplines to gain insights from different methods and approaches to research.

As part of the Multi-Disciplinary Perspectives on Global Issues series of workshops I had the chance to host the workshop, "Future Folklore: Imagining Futures through Worldbuilding." With this workshop we challenged HC students to envision what Macao might look like in 50 years. Whether one is studying to be an economist, sociologist or biologist we can all imagine and think about what new issues and possibilities might be facing us in 50 years. In seeing the creative designs and illustrations that the student teams developed it was encouraging to see the consistent playfulness and ecological awareness in the designs. There are clearly any number of challenges facing us now and in the future; but the will to listen and learn from each other gives me hope that academia has a part to play in finding some solutions.


